

Dunedin Craft Beer & Food Festival 2021
Black Rock Home Brew Competition Terms and Conditions

1. All entries must be personally **home** brewed by the entrant.
2. Commercially brewed beer is not eligible for entry. Home brewers who directly work for any commercial brewing entity may enter, though the beer **must** be brewed at home.
3. There is a \$10 entry fee for each beer entered, and a maximum of 6 brews per person. Please note: The competition organisers reserve the right to cap entry numbers to a manageable number without notice. Currently the competition is capped at **120 entries**.
4. The competition organisers are not responsible for any breakages, or for any entries that do not arrive by the cut-off date when sent via courier/post.
5. Two bottles of each entry are required for judging. The minimum size of each bottle is to be 330ml.
 1. Liability for loss or damage is the sole responsibility of the entrant.
 2. Bottles **MUST** be pressure safe. Mac's or similar bottles which do not hold pressure will be destroyed and the entry disqualified.
 3. Please attach a bottling label (link provided through application process) to **EACH** bottle. Ensure well attached if entering more than one brew!
6. All entries and payments must be made via the online form, by **8pm Sunday 3rd October. NO Payment, NO Entry.**
7. All entries must be sent or dropped off to the following address, and arrive **by 5pm Friday 15th October 2021:**

8. The same beer cannot be entered into more than one category.
9. Failure to observe the competition guidelines may result in disqualification of the entry.
10. All entries received before the closing time will be judged, with judge's feedback provided by 19 November 2021.

11. No entries will be returned whether received late or otherwise.
12. By entering The Black Rock Homebrew Competition, you allow the organisers to use all entries and result details for promotional and marketing purposes.
13. By entering The Black Rock Homebrew Competition, you allow the organisers to contact you regarding homebrew and beer related events in the future.
14. Judges, organisers, sponsors and distributors are able to enter beers into competition, but must identify themselves as such during the application process.
15. All competition results are final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
16. In the event that a winning beer is disqualified, reasonable attempts will be made to identify an alternative prize recipient.
17. It is the entrant's responsibility to provide correct contact information, to ensure that prizes can be fulfilled.
18. Judging Criteria. Judging will be conducted according to BJCP guidelines, based on the 2015 Style guidelines. <https://dev.bjcp.org/style/2015/beer/>
19. Grand Prize. The Champion Brewer, brewer of the overall winning beer (best beer from across all categories, as chosen by our panel of judges) will get the opportunity to develop a recipe with staff from Emerson's and to then brew the official Festival Beer for next year's Festival. Whilst all efforts will be made to replicate your winning recipe as much as possible, consideration will also be given to commercial and technical viability of the Festival Brew, and changes made to the recipe accordingly.
20. Festival Brew. Whilst not guaranteed, the aim for the Festival Brew is that in addition to being sold at the 2022 Dunedin Craft Beer and Food Festival, that it will also be available for sale through the Emerson's Tap Room, and participating Dunedin Craft Beer Bars.
21. The competition is only open to New Zealand residents.
